Inflation has of course impacted costs in all areas, but so far, we have managed those effectively.

There is still a lot of pool and golf time remaining, so come out and enjoy all the Club has to offer. Have a great August, everyone.

## Cap Patrol Handicap Service

This year we will be partnering with a third party handicap service called Cap Patrol. Cap Patrol is an additional program to GHIN - you will still be posting all of your scores to the GHIN server. Below is an outline of the benefits that Cap Patrol offers to Oakwood.

#### Problems Solved

- Stay in compliance with the World Handicap System guidelines to monitor and have available for peer review fellow members handicap index, scores and tournament performance
- Minimize confrontations and bad feelings with members by using data to back up adjustments to members handicaps
- Treats all players the same by electronically monitoring every handicap index per World Handicap System recommendation
- Creates level playing field for all members in tournaments
- By harnessing the data, we provide the golf staff and committee members objective information to more effectively fulfill their roles and remove many delicate issues that can lead to member and golfer disenfranchisement.



#### Golf Tips - Tilt & Rotation

How the body tilts & rotates is one of the most important aspects of the swing. A lot of times common mistakes like coming over the top are caused by an improper tilt and rotation. Below are a few things you want to try and avoid in order to allow yourself to swing properly.

**DON'T** - Lean the upper body towards the target on the backswing

• The majority of the time, this will lead to the upper body tilting away from the target on the downswing resulting in poor contact behind the golf ball

DO - Keep your core over the ball as your rotate into your backswing

• Focus on turning your chest away from the ball on the backswing without swaying off the ball.

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{DON'T}}$  - Rotate the shoulder too flat

• This often leads to an inside & flat backswing, which commonly results in the club swinging down steeply and over the top on the downswing.

DO - Feel like the lead shoulder tilts down on the backswing

• This feeling will help you swing the arms on the proper plane and avoid getting the club swinging inside on the backswing and over the top on the downswing.

#### QUICK SWING TILT DRILL

Hold a club across your shoulders by crossing your arms across your chest

Position the handle of the club on the lead/target side of your body

In the backswing get the handle to point at the ball or where the ball would be

Allow the trail side to extend and the trail knee to straighten

The lead side should feel low and the trail side high as it stretches and extends

Repeat these feels as the swing moves into the downswing and follow through

In the post impact portion of the swing the trail side lowers/shortens while the lead side will elevate and extend
