Formats Of Play



- Single Tee
 - A commonly used structure suitable for smaller groups, all golfers will tee off on the 1st tee utilizing consecutive tee times
- Double Tee
 - This format is essentially the same as two single tee's operating at the exact same time; with half of the players starting on hole #1 & the other half starting on hole #10. Ultimately, this format reduces the amount of time between the first group and the last group tee times
- Shotgun
 - Most suitable for larger groups (require a minimum # of players). This format allows all groups of players to tee off simultaneously from designated holes. Considered the most ideal format of play, a shotgun start provide the ability for all groups to return to the clubhouse at similar times in order to enjoy the after golf festivities.
- Preferred Ball (Scramble)
 - Most common format of play for outings. Teams consisting of four players will tee off, select the best drive, and play from that position. This process is continued until the ball is holed. Events can be flighted based on field size to award multiple winners.
